• Helps former refugees plan their employment, education, training & career goals & find work. The programme is available in seven regions across NZ.

• Services include:

- Helping to plan employment and career goals.
- Assessing skills, including English language skills.
- Referrals to English or vocational training opportunities.
- Assisting with the writing of CVs and cover letters.
- Helping make appointments and get interviews, as well as coaching on interview skills.
- Finding work trials and work experience.

- Intensive 48-hour course over four weeks (12 hours per week).
- Develops your job-seeking skills & English for the Kiwi workplace.
- Learn how to approach employers with a suitable CV, respond to interview questions and develop your professional networking skills.
- Your English level needs to be intermediate and above (confident users of English).

• English for Employees

- Free 30 or 45 hour, part-time course.
- Improve your English skills for your job.
- Learn more about Kiwi workplace culture and how to communicate well with customers and staff.
- Focus on work-related literacy and numeracy.
- You must be a resident with a job (full or part-time).
